Stoughton PI on CBS

Stoughton private investigator **Joe Moura** (inset) will appear on "48 Hours Mystery" on CBS Saturday, digging into the strange 2003 death of **Philip Shue** in San Antonio. The 52-year-old Air Force colonel died in a car crash that was ruled a suicide, but the circumstances were highly unusual, Moura said.

Shue's chest was gashed, his nipples were cut off, and duct tape was wrapped around his wrist and boots. His pinky finger had also been cut off, he said. "Clearly



there was foul play in this case." Moura spent several weeks examining reports on the case and interviewing witnesses in San Antonio in January. He said it wasn't enough time to solve the mystery, but he feels he was able to cast doubt on the explanation presented by the local police and medical examiner. "There were questions about his life being threatened," he said. Moura, who owns National Investigation Bureau in Stoughton, is under contract with CBS to consult on the crime show, he said. He also helped investigate the high-profile kidnapping of **Madeleine McCann** in Portugal a few years ago.
